Presentation, Beyond Prevention: "Advanced Strategies for Collaborative Care in the Treatment of Suicidality", Evergreen Conference October 2024

This presentation aims to equip those working directly with patients experiencing suicidality to better understand primary drivers of suicide and how to work collaboratively with patients experiencing suicide. We commonly hear of suicidality as being preventable and speak in terms of screening and assessment while leaving out critical components of treating suicidality. This presentation will include concepts from CBT-SP and CAMS (Collaborative Assessment and Management of Suicide) and include case presentations on utilization of the interventions and modalities. A Q&A will be a central component, and attendees are encouraged to ask the difficult questions of working with patients experiencing suicidality.

Over the last 5 years, helping professionals have been navigating supporting themselves and clients through unprecedented times.
